“HAPPY 100TH Birthday DORIS”

Doris Joan Edwards (nee Shinn)

Doris was born in Kensington, London, England on 18th June 1924, the youngest of 12 children, she had 6 sisters and 5 brothers. When she was 2 her family moved to a small village in West Sussex. The house had no running water, they drew water from a well and there was no electricity.

Doris worked as a telephonist until war broke out and then worked in an aircraft factory where she met Albert Edwards (Alb) who she married in 1951. Doris has 2 children, Jane and Mark, 6 grandchildren Chelsea, Courtney, Caitlin, Cendal, Callan and Kate, and 1 great grandson, Alby.

In 1964 the family emigrated to Australia and settled in Parafield Gardens. Doris learnt to drive and had various jobs at Malleys, Inghams and a Shell roadhouse just to name a few. In retirement Alb and Doris enjoyed holidays in Australia visiting all states with their friends Max and Merle Thomas - on one trip Doris climbed Uluru. Alb and Doris also enjoyed their caravan at Blanchetown for short getaways. Doris enjoyed playing lawn bowls for the Penfield Bowling Club, she was a great knitter and spinner and took part in many sheep to shawl competitions. In younger years she ten pinned bowled & showed Basset Hound dogs.

Alb passed away in 1995 but Doris continued with her travels visiting New Zealand on a regular basis and travelling to the UK. Doris’s friendship group provided many memorable holidays, Queensland, Canberra and a cruise to Fiji. She had a memorable cruise from Budapest to

Amsterdam and visited many European cities.

Coaching tips:

For playing on fast greens:

- A fast green requires a wider aiming line.
- Try not to have bowls cross the head. Better to have bowls past the jack (up to a metre) than short by more than a mat length.
- Reduce the speed of the bowl on delivery.
- Take a shorter delivery step (this should reduce backswing action).
- Visualise a jack shorter than the actual one and use that as a reference point to judge weight.
- Stay down in your delivery stance until the bowl has travelled at least 3 or 4 metres.

Can you be an umpire:

Q – If an end has been started but not completed due to lightning or rain stoppage, can it be continued when play recommences?

A – No, the end must be declared dead.

If all the bowls have been played, but the process of deciding the number of shots scored has not been completed prior to players leaving the green, the end must be declared dead
